I salute with folded hands, the greatest among seers, Patañjali, who removed the impurities of the mind, speech and body by composing texts on yoga, gramar and medicine respectively.

To the one who is human in form till the shoulders, who holds in his hands a conch, discus and a sword, who is thousand-headed, and white in hue, I offer my salutations.
